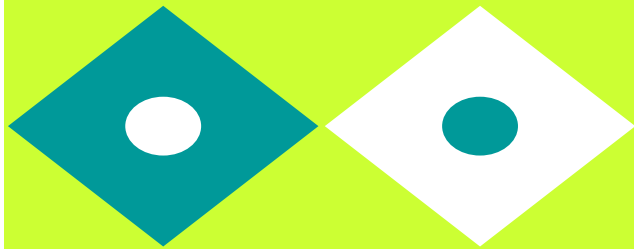

NASP rooms are filling fast! If you are presenting or attending and have not yet booked a room, please do so immediately to ensure you are staying near the conference.

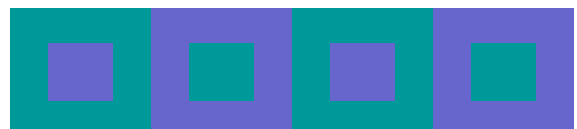
Upcoming Dates
