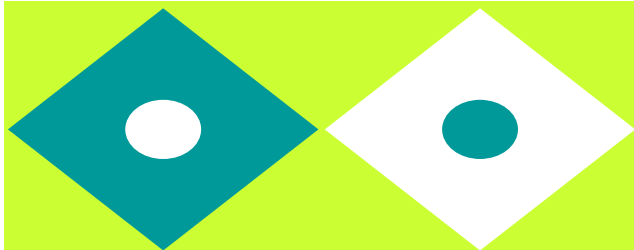

The Baltimore City Public School System is seeking a full-time school psychologist for a post beginning in January 2016. Candidates should be certified in Maryland or meet Maryland's requirements for certification outlined by the Maryland State Department of Education. (www.marylandpublicschools.org). NCSP, or NCSP eligible, is helpful for certification. Baltimore City Schools has 150 school psychologists serving 85,000 students in approximately 185 schools and programs. The Office of Psychological Services hosts 6 to 8 interns yearly and stresses involvement in leadership activities at the local, state, and national level. There is a very active local school psychology organization and the state school psychology association provides professional development workshops three times each year. School Psychology staff in City Schools are noted for their presentations at national conferences and writing for a variety of publications. The district has several special programs that school psychologist participate in, and/or, are the designated leads. Candidates for the position should send the following information: Letter of Interest, VITA, unofficial transcripts, certification (if held), NCSP (if held), 3 letters of reference, and a traditional psychological report (redacted) to: Dr. Rivka I.
