- As of July 1, 2016, doctoral students presenting research at national or international conferences are eligible to apply one time for a maximum amount of \$750.00 in travel reimbursement funds. For travel between July 1, 2016 and December 31, 2016, please submit the Fall 2016 Application for the Doctoral Student Travel Award (click here for the application).
- Dissertation Grant Awards from the Society for the Study of School Psychology (SSSP)—Request for Applications
  - The purpose of these awards of up to \$5000 is to promote excellence in research training in school psychology, thereby enhancing the capability of students to pursue productive research careers. Awards will be granted to high quality empirical studies that employ rigorous research methods and contribute to advancing the scientific base of school psychology. Please ensure that the page limits and other requirements noted in the RFA are adhered to because proposals that fail to adhere to those specifications will NOT be reviewed.
