
Postdoctoral Opportunities

Drs. Stacy Overstreet and Courtney Baker in the Department of Psychology at Tulane University (New Orleans, LA) invite applications for a full-time, one- or two-year postdoctoral research fellow to coordinate evaluation of a federally-funded experimental trial examining implementation strategies for trauma-informed approaches in six New Orleans K-8 public charter schools.
